Emerald Pool, The Kalinago Indians,

You will begin your excursion by discovering the famous *Emerald Pool*, located in the rainforest of the *Morne Trois Pitons National Park*. After a ten minute walk you will arrive at a magnificent little spectacle under the canopy. Emerald Pool is a beautiful waterfall that cascades into a pool reflecting the emerald colour of the surrounding vegetation. It is an ideal time to bathe.

On the way back there are two beautiful views, one of the Atlantic Ocean and the other of the surrounding mountain side.

Emerald Pool is accessed by Castle Bruce, or by Roger and Layou for persons on the Caribbean coast.

You will then travel along the eastern coast of the island to the *Carib Territory*, a 3,700-acre site assigned by the British government to the Indian people in 1903.

You will discover colorful villages and flowers along the edge of the Atlantic coast of the island. 3,500 descendants of the Caribbean Indians live there.

You will then have your picnic at the seaside.

You will take a break on the edge of the village of *Barana Auté*, located in *Salibya* near the *Crayfish River*, the original and central place of life in the territory. You can purchase local wicker-work such as baskets, hats made from Larouma fibers and reeds. You will also see the fish traps of the last Kalinago people.

To immerse yourself in this culture you should visit the *Touna Auté village*.

This vibrant village of the Kalinago community is located in Concorde, next to the Pagua River.

This encounter offers the unique experience of understanding the legacy of the *Kalinagos*.

The village chief Irvince will explain the past life of the Kalinagos and their vision of the future.

You will be offered a taste of Cassava bread.

Then, to finish off your day, you will travel through the villages of Concorde and Bells.
